- Students must pass all required courses, adhere to registration requirements and restrictions of RHSA, and earn:
 - At least 60 credits toward the degree
 - At least 34 credits of UConn RHSA courses
 - At least a 2.0 Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)
- No more than 6 credits of Independent Study, Internships and Special topics may be applied toward the AAS degree, unless approved by the Director.
- Students should use their Academic Requirements Report (accessible in Student Admin) along with this Plan of Study to view their graduation requirements and assess status toward degree. Students must be attentive to credit restrictions (repeated courses, out of sequence classes, etc.).
- Courses taken Pass/Fail may NOT be used to meet ANY degree requirements, including major requirements, General Education requirements, or Common Curriculum requirements.
- Students are responsible for knowing and understanding the rules and requirements of their degree. Always refer to the Catalog (linked below) for official regulations and ask your advisor when you need clarification.
